RESOLUTION 2018-109

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BORDENTOWN OPPOSING THE APPLICATION OF ELCON RECYCLING SERVICES, LLC. RESUBMITTED TO THE PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR A PROPOSED HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITY TO BE LOCATED IN FALLS TOWNSHIP, PA

WHEREAS, Elcon Recycling Services, LLC has resubmitted an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency which would allow for the construction of a thermal oxidizer facility in Falls Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, according to the Clean Air Council, Elcon has applied to received 596 different kinds of waste, producing 800 tons of hazardous sludge per year and 5,000 tons of hazardous salts; and

WHEREAS, given the prevailing winds out of the west, the location of this facility will undoubtedly have a direct impact on the residents of the City of Bordentown and other surrounding communities; and


WHEREAS, the proposed proximity of this facility to the Delaware River will also have a direct impact on the water supply of over 8 million residents; and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Bordentown to represent and protect the interests, health and quality of life of the residents of the City of Bordentown.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Bordentown, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, that it does hereby oppose the construction of this facility and further urges the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency to consider the negative impact that the proposed hazardous thermal oxidizer facility would have on the residents of Burlington County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this resolution to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency; Burlington County Municipal Clerks; and the Burlington County Board of Chosen Freeholders.
