

September 29, 2020 Update – Special Meeting

1. Roadways

- a. West Street: Concrete is nearing completion and paving will follow
- b. Oliver Street: City will be organizing a community outreach effort to talk about our next infrastructure (road and water) project. Surveys will be distributed within next week.
- c. New Grant Opportunity with NJDOT (due in November): There is a new grant opportunity that the city will be exploring focusing on transportation alternatives and will involve coordination with the county.

2. Projects

- a. Hankins Alley: Construction contract was approved. Flyer to affected residents and businesses will be distributed in the next week and mobilization will be in October.
- b. Parks: City has allocated funds in the capital projects to undertake a few playground upgrades (including Carlslake and West in the short term) and a few smaller park improvements. We will be coordinating with a few committees shortly to obtain feedback.
- c. City received notification from the County about a parks grant award in the amount of \$88,900 for new open space at West/Borden.
- d. Pedestrian safety:
 - i. Repave city parking lot (near OTP): Concrete work started recently (pavement likely in early October)
 - ii. Annual tree/sidewalk program: Just reviewed the tree list prior to tonight's meeting and will post online. Work will be starting later this fall.

3. Water Department

- a. Asset Management Plan (AMP): Water capital budget includes several projects including meter replacements and well upgrades.
- b. Lead compliance sampling for the first half of the 2020 year is complete and the city has returned to state compliance.
- c. Sampling for the current period is underway (47 samples taken with zero exceedances).
- d. The City remains committed to providing safe, reliable, lead-free water to its residents, that minimizes the dissolving of lead from residential piping and faucets. We are also continuing the program of free lead testing to any resident who requests it.
- e. Department worked on a significant water leak at Second and Park yesterday.

4. Misc:

- a. Presenting approval of agreement with Kings Gate Condo Association tonight
- b. Attended the most recent Veterans Committee meeting and working together
- c. City will be cleaning out storm inlets in the next few weeks, especially along Prince Street
- d. DPW is working with the Green Team and will be building a third pizza box bin
- e. Stormwater outfalls: City will be working with the state to create a digital map of our outfall locations
